School Dinners

School dinners next half-term (Monday 4th September to Friday 20th October) will cost:-

KS1 Free

KS2 35 days @ £2.00 £70.00 (£10.00 per week)

Years 4 & 5 34 days @ £2.00 £68.00

Fun Fridays - KS2 7 days @ £2.00 £14.00

Please remember dinner payments are made through the Tucasi cashless system.

As a parent/guardian, you will have been allocated an account for your child and issued with a barcoded letter. If your child(ren) receive Universal Infant Free School Meals or Free School Meals, you are not required to make any payment. However, you are encouraged to register online if you wish to keep track of your child's daily meal uptake.

You will have various methods of making payment securely such as:

Online - using a debit card via Tucasi's internet payment service www.scopay.com

Over the counter - by presenting the barcoded letter at any PayPoint outlet. **Via mobile device -** by visiting the Tucasi website (<u>www.scopay.com</u>) and accessing the special mobile friendly features.

As a reminder no cash or cheques for top up will be taken at school

Please note: If your child changes from dinners to packed lunch, or vice versa, you must give the kitchen one week's notice. If dinner money is not paid for 1 week, no further meals will be provided until the debt is cleared.

As a school we endorse the position of the catering services and will not be supplying dinner to a child if the kitchen refuses to give a meal. If the child has not got a packed lunch, we will contact you; you will then have the responsibility of making sure that you provide a lunch for your child.

Reminders

Swimming Lessons

Due to a shortfall of over £2,000, a decision was made by governors on Tuesday to change the way swimming takes place at Bramingham. We will only send Year 3 children swimming for the year. This way children will have a longer period of swimming practices which will help them learn to swim the 25m expected, as laid down in the National Curriculum. Those that can swim this length will of course be extended further, in terms of their swimming skills.

We will be taking our school mini buses, and although this will be time consuming in terms of staffing, it does mean that we are not allowed to make any charges for children using the mini buses, so the cost of swimming will reduce for Year 3 parents. The cost for Year 3, for each half term will be halved. (So it should be approximately £1.70 a session, letters will be sent out in September)

Milk

Milk will be available for children from Monday 18th September. Letters with details of the cost will be sent out on the first day of term, Monday 4th September.

Clubs

A letter will be sent out in September giving information about new club times and starting dates.

Lost Property

We are seeing increasing amounts of lost property each term, so can we remind you to please **ensure you name all uniform** - especially school sweatshirts. If they are clearly named we can return them to your child.

Children Cycling to School

We encourage children to ride their bikes or scooters to school. Please remind your children of road safety and how to ride their bikes in a safe way. We have had several near misses!

We would also like to remind parents that, for safety reasons, before the start and at the end of the school day, children should not ride their bikes or scooters, play football or use any of the equipment in the school playground.

Children's safety in Freeman Avenue

Can we remind parents to avoid driving up Freeman Avenue to drop their children off for school unless they have a pass as this can put children at risk. We have had dangerous incidents reported to us by our site agent who is on attendance at the school gate in the morning and in the afternoon:-

Parking/Access to the school

The school car park should only be used by staff and school visitors. Parents should not be driving into the school car park to drop off or collect their children unless:-

- It is to drop them off at Breakfast Club (before 8.45) am or to collect them from our After School Club or other after school clubs.
- They have a disabled badge; we have spaces in the school car park which are reserved for people driving cars with disabled badges **only**.
- They have been authorised by the school and have a school permit (these are issued by the school office in specific circumstances).

Dogs on the school premises

Dogs may be allowed on the school premises but we must all be mindful of the health safety risk that this may cause and the fact that some children and adults will be scared of dogs. Dog owners have to act responsibly and ensure that their pet will not cause harm or distress and therefore may enter the school grounds as long as they respect the following rules:-

- Keep dogs on a tight leash and ensure they are aware of people's reactions around their pet and that their pet does not behave in an aggressive manner towards people or other dogs
- Make sure that their dog does not foul on the school grounds or ensure that if they do, they clear it up immediately

No Smoking

In line with the council's policy, Bramingham Primary School is AT ALL TIMES A NO SMOKING SCHOOL. May we therefore remind parents not to smoke (this includes smoking electronic cigarettes) on the school premises. This also applies to the school car park, playground and playing field.

The safety of our/your children is paramount to us all!
