<u>School Dinners</u>

School dinners this half-term (Monday 31st October to Tuesday 20th December) will cost:-

KS1 KS2	Free 37 days @ £1.95	£72.15 (£9.75 per week)
Fun Fridays - KS2	7 days @ £1.95	£13.65

You can view the School Dinners menu around the school and on our website (bramingham.net) in the Parents section.

Please remember dinner payments are still made through the Allpay online payment methods; you will need to top up your child's account. You have the freedom to top-up securely in a number of ways:

online - using a debit card via Allpay's internet payment services - www.allpayments.net

over the phone - using a debit card via Allpay's telephone payment services - 0844 557 8321 **over the counter** - by presenting the barcoded letter at any PayPoint or Post Office outlet **through the Allpay App** - available to download from the Apple App Store or Google Play for your smartphone. This option is proving to be most popular.

You will have been advised that a **new provider for the payment of school meals** will be put in place soon!

As part of a continuous effort to improve online payment methods LBC Catering Services reviewed its provider, and they are pleased to inform you that Tucasi will be the new provider. This system proves to be user friendly and easy to navigate.

As a parent/guardian, you will be allocated an account for your child and issued with a barcoded letter. If your child(ren) receive Universal Infant Free School Meals or Free School Meals, you are not required to make any payment. However, you are encouraged to register online if you wish to keep track of your child's daily meal uptake.

You will have various methods of making payment securely such as:

Online - using a debit card via Tucasi' s internet payment service <u>www.scopay.com</u> **Over the counter** - by presenting the barcoded letter at any PayPoint outlet. **Via mobile device** – by visiting the Tucasi website (<u>www.scopay.com</u>) and accessing the special mobile friendly features.

As a reminder no cash or chegues for top up will be taken at school

You will have access to an online account where all payment information is held on a secure server storing details of individual cash balances and transactions.

In due course you will receive your barcoded letter containing your new unique payment reference number (PRN), with further information on how to register your account online.

Please do not credit your child's account on Tucasi until you are advised of the go-live date for the school.

All outstanding debit and credit balances will be transferred to the new system as an opening balance.

We hope that you will support us and we will all start to see the benefits of this new and innovative system immediately. Should you have any concerns or questions, please call LBC Catering Services on 01582 538210. We aim to make the transition to the new Cashless system as smooth as possible.

Please note: If your child changes from dinners to packed lunch, or vice versa, you must give the kitchen one week's notice. If dinner money is not paid for 1 week, no further meals will be provided until the debt is cleared.

As a school we endorse the position of the catering services and will not be supplying dinner to a child if the kitchen refuses to give a meal. If the child has not got a packed lunch, we will contact you; you will then have the responsibility of making sure that you provide a lunch for your child.

Reminders/School's rules

As we are in a new academic year and have new parents in school, I thought it would be an opportunity to send you all a few reminders of some of the school's expectations.

School Uniform

We are noticing a recent drop in the high standards we expect. See below details of our school uniform:

GIRLS

- Navy skirt/trousers, pinafore dress, red and white checked gingham dress, navy shorts
- White blouse or polo shirt, red or navy polo neck jumpers/polo shirts
- Red sweatshirt/jumper
- White or blue socks (during the winter months, navy or red tights may be preferred)
- Brown/black/blue shoes, blue/white/red sandals. NOT trainers.

BOYS

- Navy trousers/shorts
- White shirt or polo shirt, red polo neck jumpers, white or red polo shirts
- Red sweatshirt/jumper
- Grey or navy socks
- Brown/black/blue shoes, NOT trainers
- A navy and red tie is available.

Please be aware that if boots are worn to school, children should change into their shoes whilst on the school premises. If sandals are 'too open' children will not be allowed to participate in some activities. Trainers are <u>not</u> to be worn in school, only for PE lessons, or lunchtimes. The headbands which have 'ears' on them are also not suitable.

PE clothing

GIRLS AND BOYS

- Navy shorts
- Red T-shirt
- Plimsolls or suitable footwear for outdoor use
- Indoor Physical Education will be barefoot
- Navy or red leotards or gym skirts for girls' P.E. are optional

It is essential that children have a change of clothing for P.E.

It would be much appreciated if a bag with a drawstring, labelled with your child's name, could be provided for keeping the kit together.

During the winter months, it is ESSENTIAL that the children are provided with a tracksuit or similar warm clothing for outdoor P.E. Where possible, these should be red or navy.

Although it is preferable that P.E. kits are left in school throughout the week, please note that in the event of a fire, P.E. kit left at school will not be covered for replacement or cleaning.

All individual items of school uniform MUST have the child's name clearly marked.

Parking

We would like to remind all parents that *the school car park should only be used by staff, school visitors, parents with parking permits* (these are issued by the school under special circumstances) *or for dropping off children at Breakfast Club or picking up from After School Club.*

Cars should <u>not</u> be parked on the yellow lines outside school. Cars parked in this area cause an obstruction in general, and in particular they block pushchair access. We would appreciate your co-operation in this matter, for the safety of all concerned. We are very fortunate that Sainsbury's store has always very kindly allowed parents to park in their car park when dropping off children. There is also the car park at the back of the Bramingham Public House/Local shops. Please make sure you use these facilities and also avoid parking in Campania Grove or Cicero Drive.

If you are allowed to drive in the school car park please make sure you drive **VERY** slowly.

Children's safety outside the school gates and the school car park

Parents need to remind their children not to run across the top of Freeman Avenue or wander off the footpath onto the car park. There have been numerous near misses with cars driving in or out of the school premises.

Bikes and Scooters

Children coming to school on their bikes or scooters should not ride them along the school footpaths, or the playground. Once on the premises, they should walk alongside their scooters as riding them can be dangerous with so many children and adults around.

Dropping Off and Collection of Children

The school day starts at 9.00am; children may come into their classrooms from 8.45am. Any child not present for registration will be marked as late on the register and this will affect their attendance record. No child or adult is allowed into classrooms or the school building before 8.45am (unless previously arranged with a member of staff) as staff could be meeting together there, or elsewhere in the school.

The Dell outside door should only be used for Breakfast Club and After School Club parents.

Please make sure the front entrance to the school building is only used if you need to talk to a member of our office staff or if your child is arriving late to school or returning from an appointment. There are still a number of parents who walk through the main entrance in the mornings after dropping off their children; please leave the school via the classrooms or outside cloakroom doors unless you need to speak to the office staff.

The school day finishes at 3.30pm; children need to be collected at the end of the day unless they are allowed to walk home. If you have been delayed and cannot collect your child on time, please contact the office to make alternative arrangements. To increase children's safety, a child cannot be left unsupervised in the school. Should we not hear from you by 3.40pm, we will provide a place for your child at After School Club and will request payment from you the following day, as stated on your admission form.

School Apparatus

We would like to remind parents that children should not be on the school apparatus before or after school when they are not supervised by a member of staff.

Early Years gates

The new Early Years area has been fenced off for the children's safety. We would therefore ask you to close the gates behind you when leaving the Early Years unit after dropping off your children.

Snacks

Children are allowed to have a snack for morning break or in their lunch boxes. All snacks should be healthy snacks such as fresh fruits and vegetables. Winders are not a healthy option and are not allowed.

Lost Property

Please ensure that all items of school clothing (**and lunchboxes**) are marked clearly with your child's name (or even initials). This helps greatly when items are misplaced, and we can then ensure that items are returned to their owners quickly. Our lost property boxes are always overflowing with items which are not named making it impossible for us to find the right owners.

Appointments

Could you please make every possible effort to avoid taking children out of school for appointments, such as doctor and dental. We have noted an increase in the number of children being collected during the school day for such appointments.

Child's Personal Information

It is essential that you let the office staff know of any changes in your details (e.g. email, address, telephone number, mobile number or personal circumstances) so that our contact records are kept up-to-date. If you change your address we need to see a proof of address e.g. utility bill or a solicitor's letter confirming the sale completion.

Money Collection

Any money being sent to school (trips/BC/ASC, milk etc.) **must not** be taken to the school office; it should be sent in a named envelope and given to the class teacher first thing in the morning.

No Smoking

In line with the council's policy, Bramingham Primary School is **AT ALL TIMES A NO SMOKING SCHOOL.** May we therefore remind parents not to smoke on the school's premises. This includes the school car park, playground and playing field.
