School Dinners

(Please note that the Council has approved an increase of 5p in the price of school meals from 1st April, 2017)

Next half term (Tuesday 18th April, 2017 to Friday 26th May, 2017) school dinners will cost:-

KS2 28 days @ £2.00 £56.00 (£10.00 per week)

Yr 6 children going to PGL 26 days @ £2.00 £52.00

Fun Fridays x 6 KS2 £12.00

You can view the School Dinners' menu around the school and on our website (bramingham.net) in the Parents' section.

Please remember dinner payments are made through the Tucasi cashless system.

As a parent/guardian, you will have been allocated an account for your child and issued with a barcoded letter. If your child(ren) receive Universal Infant Free School Meals or Free School Meals, you are not required to make any payment. However, you are encouraged to register online if you wish to keep track of your child's daily meal uptake.

You will have various methods of making payment securely such as:

Online - using a debit card via Tucasi's internet payment service www.scopay.com **Over the counter -** by presenting the barcoded letter at any PayPoint outlet. **Via mobile device -** by visiting the Tucasi website (www.scopay.com) and accessing the special mobile friendly features.

As a reminder no cash or cheques for top up will be taken at school

Please note: If your child changes from dinners to packed lunch, or vice versa, you must give the kitchen one week's notice. If dinner money is not paid for 1 week, no further meals will be provided until the debt is cleared.

As a school we endorse the position of the catering services and will not be supplying dinner to a child if the kitchen refuses to give a meal. If the child has not got a packed lunch, we will contact you; you will then have the responsibility of making sure that you provide a lunch for your child.

Dropping Off and Collection of Children

We are finding that more and more children are arriving late into school in the morning. Please note that the school day starts at 9.00am, and children may come into their classrooms from 8.45am. Any child not present for registration will be marked as late on the register and this will affect their attendance record which is monitored by the school's Education Welfare Officer who carries out a check on our registers half termly.

We are also finding that we have more children being collected late by their parent or carers. The school day finishes at 3.30pm and children need to be collected at the end of the day unless they are allowed to walk home. If you have been delayed and cannot collect your child on time, please contact the office to make alternative arrangements if at all possible before 3.30pm. To increase children's safety, a child cannot be left unsupervised in the school. Should we not hear from you by 3.40pm, we will provide a place for your child at After School Club and will request payment from you the following day, as stated on your admission form.

Please make sure the front entrance to the school building is only used if you need to talk to a member of our office staff. There are still a number of parents who walk through the main entrance in the mornings, after dropping off their children; please leave the school via the classrooms or outside cloakroom doors unless you need to speak to the office staff.

REMINDERS

Football in the school playground

Staff have noticed and it has been pointed out by some parents, that children play football in the school playground at the end of the school day, which can be dangerous (we have had incidents in the past including a parent being hit by a ball and also a baby's pushchair), or go on the mini roundabout and climbing frames. We do not supervise the children once they have left their classrooms; staff have to attend meetings, or run clubs after school and an accident could happen for which we might be held responsible. We would therefore appreciate it if you could keep your children under supervision and leave school premises promptly. If this situation does not improve we will be locking the gates to the school playground at 3.40pm.

Bramingham Primary School Website

Don't forget to access our website for news and information, as well as photos and details of activities in your child's class. All letters can be downloaded and if needed printed from the website. Please note that we are adding to it regularly; news, photos and links to activities are frequently updated, so check back often.

Appointments

Could you please make every possible effort to avoid taking children out of school for appointments, such as doctor and dental ones. We have noted an increase in the number of children being collected during the school day for such appointments.

Parking

We would like to remind all parents that *the school car park should only be used by staff, school visitors or parents with parking permits* (these are issued by the school under special circumstances).

Cars should <u>not</u> be parked on the yellow lines outside school. Cars parked in this area cause an obstruction in general, and in particular they block pushchair access. We would appreciate your co-operation in this matter, for the safety of all concerned. We are very fortunate that Sainsbury's store has always very kindly allowed parents to park in their car park when dropping off children. There is also the car park at the back of the Bramingham Public House/Local shops. Please make sure you use these facilities and also avoid parking in Campania Grove or Cicero Drive.

Child's Personal Information

It is essential that you let the office staff know of any changes in your details (e.g. email, address, telephone number, mobile number or personal circumstances) so that our contact records are kept up-to-date. If you change your address we will need to see a proof of address e.g. utility bill or a solicitor's letter confirming the sale completion.

Lost Property

Please ensure that all items of school clothing (**and lunchboxes**) are marked clearly with your child's name. This helps greatly when items are misplaced, and we can then ensure that items

are returned to their owners quickly. Our lost property boxes are overflowing with items which are not named making it impossible for us to find the right owners.

Money Collection

Any money being sent to school (trips/BC/ASC etc.) **must not** be taken to the school office; it should be sent in a named envelope and given to the class teacher first thing in the morning.

No Smoking

In line with the council's policy, Bramingham Primary School is **AT ALL TIMES A NO SMOKING SCHOOL.** May we therefore remind parents not to smoke on the school's premises. This includes the school car park, playground and playing field.
