Please remember dinner payments are made through the Allpay Cashless system; you will need to top up your child's account. As a parent/guardian, you will have been allocated with an account for your child and issued with a barcoded letter. You have the freedom to top-up securely in a number of ways:

online - using a debit card via Allpay's internet payment services - www.allpayments.net

over the phone - using a debit card via Allpay's telephone payment services - 0844 557 8321 **over the counter** - by presenting the barcoded letter at any PayPoint or Post Office outlet **through the Allpay App** - available to download from the Apple App Store or Google Play for your smartphone. This option is proving to be most popular.

No cash or cheques for top up will be taken at school.

Please note: If your child changes from dinners to packed lunch, or vice versa, you must give the kitchen one week's notice. If dinner money is not paid for 1 week, no further meals will be provided until the debt is cleared.

As a school we endorse the position of the catering services and will not be supplying dinner to a child if the kitchen refuses to give a meal. If the child has not got a packed lunch, we will contact you; you will then have the responsibility of making sure that you provide a lunch for your child.

Lost Property

We are seeing increasing amounts of lost property each term, so can we remind you to please **ensure you name all uniform** - especially school sweatshirts. If they are clearly named we can return them to your child.

Children Cycling to School

We encourage children to ride their bikes or scooters to school. Please remind your children of road safety and how to ride their bikes in a safe way. We have had several near misses!

We would also like to remind parents that, for safety reasons, before the start and at the end of the school day, children should not ride their bikes or scooters, play football or use any of the equipment in the school playground.

Children's safety in Freeman Avenue

Can we remind parents to avoid driving up Freeman Avenue to drop their children off for school unless they have a pass as this can put children at risk. We have had dangerous incidents reported to us by our site agent who is on attendance at the school gate in the morning and in the afternoon:-

Front Gate (Cars, Taxis, Parking)

Numbers of parents and taxis trying to gain access to the school during the 'exclusion time' have significantly increased recently; equally parents continue to park at the side of the road down Freeman Avenue. Cars parked in this area cause an obstruction in general, and in particular some of them block pushchair access. A combination of the two is causing a significant problem to the safety of the children.

We are very fortunate that Sainsbury's store has always very kindly allowed parents to park in their car park when dropping off or collecting children. When using Sainsbury's car park, do not drop off or collect children by just momentarily stopping by the access ramp in the car park. There can be a long line of cars stopped adjacent to the wall dropping off or picking up children resulting in a number of close shaves with cars turning into and out of the aisle. Although it is not our area, Sainsbury's goodwill might be stretched if accidents were to start to happen. There is also the car park at the back of The Bramingham public house/local shops. Please make sure you use this facility and avoid parking in Campania Grove, Cicero Drive as this area is for the use of local residents and their visitors or in Quantock Court car park as it is reserved for residents and transport/ambulances.

We would appreciate your co-operation in this matter, for the safety of all concerned.

Parking/Access to the school

The school car park should only be used by staff and school visitors. Parents should not be driving into the school car park to drop off or collect their children unless:-

• It is to drop them off at Breakfast Club (before 8.45) am or to collect them from our After School Club or other after school clubs.

- They have a disabled badge; we have spaces in the school car park which are reserved for people driving cars with disabled badges **only**.
- They have been authorised by the school and have a school permit (these are issued by the school office in specific circumstances).

Dogs on the school premises

Dogs may be allowed on the school premises but we must all be mindful of the health safety risk that this may cause and the fact that some children and adults will be scared of dogs. Dog owners have to act responsibly and ensure that their pet will not cause harm or distress and therefore may enter the school grounds as long as they respect the following rules:-

- Keep dogs on a tight leash and ensure they are aware of people's reactions around their pet and that their pet does not behave in an aggressive manner towards people or other dogs
- Make sure that their dog does not foul on the school grounds or ensure that if they do, they clear it up immediately

No Smoking

In line with the council's policy, Bramingham Primary School is AT ALL TIMES A NO SMOKING SCHOOL. May we therefore remind parents not to smoke (this includes smoking electronic cigarettes) on the school premises. This also applies to the school car park, playground and playing field.

The safety of our/your children is paramount to us all!
