Early Years: The children have performed their first Nativity, which you can watch on the website. Staff are proud at how well the children learnt new songs, remembered their words and spoke loudly. Enjoy!

Year 1: We have awesome readers and writers! The children have written wonderful stories about toys. They have also been working extremely hard with their phonics. We look forward to more amazing learning next term!

Year 4: We have explored the mysteries of Egypt in our topic, 'What's in the tomb?' The children have written their own suspense stories, which have left us on the edge of our seats. In art, the children have created their own clay tiles that represent the Eye of Horus. We know that they are looking forward to bringing these home to you.

Year 5: We have loved journeying back to the Anglo-Saxon era to explore different aspects of their lives. We wrote epic tales inspired by Beowulf. We were less convinced by the rather garlicky pottage!

Year 6: After creating some amazing Gunpowder leaflets, we were visited Andrew (an amazing actor from the Young Shakespeare Theatre Company). This was followed by some wonderful work on Macbeth. The term has ended with us creating Stop Motion animations around the spells we created.
