Headteachers' Message

This week sees a year since the first lockdown. Who could have predicted the extraordinary year we have all faced? So many people have been affected by the virus and all our lives have been impacted in some way.

Over the course of the year, the children have been remarkable in switching from being in school to remote learning. It was lovely to see the full return of all children on March 8th, but unfortunately, over the last few weeks, we have had a number of bubbles having to isolate. To support us in reducing the transmission, we encourage families who are not showing symptoms to regularly access a rapid test (see 'Home Test Kits' below). Regular testing of families will help keep the whole community safe and prevent the spread of the virus. We have been informed that testing regularly has helped to identify asymptomatic cases- the latest information is that as many as 1 in 3 people are asymptomatic.

We would like to reassure you that we have tight measures and procedures in place to minimise the transmission in school.

We will continue to review our measures to ensure we do our best to keep our school community safe.

Home Test Kits

A reminder that families are able to collect home testing kits from the community testing sites at Bury Park, Vicarage Street and Hockwell Ring. There is a maximum of 2 boxes per person. Each box contains 7 testing kits.

As of Monday 29th March, home test kits can be collected from the 3 static test sites – Lewsey, Farley and Central Library.

Tree Planting

During lockdown, we were donated 200 trees by Trees4Luton. Our Year 3 children had the opportunity to plant the trees on the school field.





The children now have the responsibility of watering the trees regularly and caring for them, ensuring they have all they need, to grow.

Doodle Easter Challenge!
